### NOTES:

1. *Italicized* courses satisfy both ACC and Texas State Core Curriculum requirements. This transfer planning guide is not "Core Complete."
2. Courses with an asterisk (\*) satisfy the Business Field of Study (FOS) curriculum. This guide is "FOS Complete."
3. Nine hours of designated "writing intensive" (WI) courses must be completed at Texas State to satisfy degree requirements.
4. This transfer planning guide shows a suggested course of study at both institutions. Students may want to consider taking select courses in summer semesters instead, provided that they are offered and are in the correct sequence needed for their degree and major program.
5. If two years of the same foreign language were not completed in high school, students must take 6-8 hours of the same foreign language.
6. Students are allowed a maximum of 66 transferable hours from a two-year college.
7. Upon completion of certain course requirements at Texas State, students may elect to send these hours back to ACC to be applied toward an associate's degree. This is commonly referred to as "reverse transfer."

The appropriate course equivalency guide and/or transfer planning guide should be consulted to resolve questions of course transferability. Courses acceptable for transfer by Texas State will transfer at the level at which the courses were taken (i.e., acceptable courses from a community/junior college transfer as freshman or sophomore courses and cannot be used to satisfy junior/senior-level requirements). A maximum of 66 hours from an accredited community/junior college may be applied to a business degree.
